WOMEN'S GLOBAL CHARTER FOR HUMANITY

The global actions of the World March of Women in 2005

The World March of Women is a global feminist action network supported by close to 6000 women's groups in 163 countries and territories throughout the world. Its primary objective is to fight poverty and violence against women and was established as a tool to reinforce and uphold a vast solidarity movement of grass-roots women's groups as a symbol women the world over can identify with.

For us, feminism is a way of thinking,

a living movement, an alternative, a different way of seeing the world. It goes beyond being a simple observation of inequalities or a power struggle.

We have the strength to fight to undo the systems that perpetuate fear and hatred and that justify violence, more specifically patriarchy, as well as all systems that engender exclusion, reinforce domination, control our bodies and separate us from our dreams.

A TOOL WITH WHICH TO BUILD THE WORLD

On March 8, 2005, we launch the Women's Global Charter for Humanity to bring together our proposals and our aspirations for an anti-capitalist world, a world free of chauvinism, exploitation and prejudice.

The creation of the Charter is a collective process involving women's groups from around the world whose goal is to provide a common political vision, an identity that is already reflected in our actions, and to put into collective action our determination to change the world.

The Charter will be adopted during the 5th International Meeting of the World March of Women which will take place December 4 -12, in Kigali, Rwanda, in the Great Lakes Region of Africa. This is our way of honouring the women of

that region who are struggling to bring peace and mutual understanding to an area marked by genocide and war.

On March 8, 2005, the Charter will begin its world-wide journey in Sao Paulo, Brazil and complete it on October 17, in Burkina Faso, one of the poorest countries in the world. But it will only be a stopover for us to catch our breath before beginning to march once again, because as long as there are inequalities and injustices, we will continue to resist.

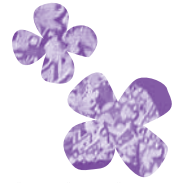
Between Sao Paulo and Ouagadougou, the Charter will make stops in over fifty countries, regions or territories: in large cities, in rural areas, on borders and so on. The national coordinating bodies and the participating groups in the March are already busy organizing activities to coincide with the Charter's

arrival. The Relay of the Charter is yet another proof that we are capable of linking and organizing throughout the world.

In the Americas, the Charter will stop in Brazil, the border area between Brazil, Argentina and Uruguay, in Argentina, Bolivia, Peru, Ecuador, Columbia, Trinidad and Tobago, Haiti, Cuba, Honduras, El Salvador, Mexico, the United States, Canada and Quebec.



NATIONAL ACTIONS



As well as participating in the global actions described above, each country is autonomous in organizing initiatives based on its own aspirations, while respecting the objectives and values of the World March of Women. You are invited to:

- Organize a launch of the Charter in your country on March 8, 2005
- Organize a national relay march and popular education activities to promote the Charter
- Organize an hour of feminist solidarity on October 17, 2005 from noon to 1pm local time

Assembled during the World Relay, the Global Solidarity Quilt will translate into images of the Women's Global Charter for Humanity in all its diversity.
